Module I: Cooperative Legislation Landmarks & Recent Trends

Covers historical evolution of cooperative law in India, central/state legislations, Model Cooperative Acts, Vaidyanathan Committee reforms, and Union Ministry of Cooperation initiatives.

Unit 1: Landmarks in Indian Cooperative Legislation

Evolution from British colonial relief measures to constitutional status under 97th Constitutional Amendment Act, 2011 (Right to form cooperatives under Art 19(1)(c) & Directive Principle Art 43B).

Unit 2: Early Acts & Kerala Cooperative Societies Act, 1969

1. **Act of 1904:** First legislation covering primary agricultural credit societies only.
2. **Act of 1912:** Extended legal framework to non-credit societies and central/apex federations.
3. **Kerala Cooperative Societies (KCS) Act, 1969:** Comprehensive state law governing registration, management, audit, inquiry, and liquidation in Kerala.

Unit 3: Multi-State & Model Cooperative Societies Acts

Multi-State Cooperative Societies (MSCS) Act, 1984 / 2002 for societies operating in multiple states.
Model Cooperative Societies Act, 1991 (Choudhary Brahm Perakash Committee) promoting member autonomy.

Unit 4: Vaidyanathan Committee Task Force Report

Task Force on Revival of Short-Term Rural Cooperative Credit Structure (2004). Key reforms: Financial recapitalization conditional on institutional autonomy, professional management, and audit by CAs.

Unit 5: Union Ministry of Cooperation Initiatives (2021 Onwards)

"Sahakar Se Samridhhi" vision. Establishment of dedicated Ministry of Cooperation (2021). Initiatives: National Cooperative Database, Computerization of 63,000 PACS, and setting up Multi-State Export, Organic, & Seed Cooperatives.
